Definition of amicus curiae. : one (such as a professional person or organization) that is not a party to a particular litigation but that is permitted by the court to advise it in respect to some matter of law that directly affects the case in question.

### Amicus Curiae | Definition of Amicus Curiae by Merriam-Webster

An amicus curiae (literally, " friend of the court "; plural: amici curiae) is someone who is not a party to a case who assists a court by offering information, expertise, or insight that has a bearing on the issues in the case. The decision on whether to consider an amicus brief lies within the discretion of the court.

### **Amicus curiae legal definition of amicus curiae**

Amicus curiae, (Latin: "friend of the court"), one who assists the court by furnishing information or advice regarding questions of law or fact. He is not a party to a lawsuit and thus differs from an intervenor, who has a direct interest in the outcome of the lawsuit and is therefore permitted to participate as a party to the suit. An amicus curiae normally may not participate except by leave of the court, and most courts seldom permit persons to appear in such a capacity.
