Kant completely understood the existence of academic art or "mechanical art," as he termed it, which was "a mere art of industry" and he separated the merely trained and skilled artist from the "genius." "Genius," he said, "can only furnish rich material for products of beautiful art; its execution and its form require talent cultivated in the schools, in order to make use of this material as will stand examination by the judgment."

While formerly, philosophical aesthetics was largely content to take its primary examples of beauty and sublimity from nature, after Kant the focus is placed squarely on works of art. Now, in Kant, fine art seems to 'borrow' its beauty or sublimity from nature. Fine art is therefore a secondary concept.

Kant has a definition of art, and of fine art; the latter, which Kant calls the art of genius, is "a kind of representation that is purposive in itself and, though without an end, nevertheless promotes the cultivation of the mental powers for sociable communication" (Kant, Critique of the Power of Judgment, Guyer translation, section 44, 46.) When fully unpacked, the definition has representational, formalist and expressivist elements, and focuses as much on the creative activity of the ...

In the early 18th century, empiricist philosophers such as Hutcheson and Hume were primarily concerned with the standards and logic of our judgements of taste and beauty. The real impetus to the idea of aesthetics as a distinctive branch of philosophy ocured in the work of Baumgarten and Kant.
