

Rn Staffing In The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Nann

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Nurse staffing ratios in neonatal services are set at one nurse per intensive care baby; one nurse to two high dependency babies; and one nurse for four special care babies with an additional shift coordinator. In addition, it is recommended that at least 70% of registered nursing staff on duty should have a neonatal specialist qualification.

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A regional workforce strategy should be developed by Neonatal Networks in conjunction with relevant local Health Education boards, Local Maternity Systems, and national bodies including RCPCH and the Royal College of Nursing (RCN). Neonatal units should review medical and nurse staffing requirements using the snapshot, local and national benchmarking data, eg National Neonatal Audit Project, GIRFT datapacks.

In determining staffing requirements for neonatal services: 1. Boards must ensure there is a strategic multiprofessional staffing review at least annually (or more frequently if service changes are planned or quality or workforce concerns are identified), which is aligned to the operational planning process.

In a two stage cohort study, data were collected in 104 NICUs in 2008 by nurse survey (6,038 nurses and 15,191 infants assigned to them) and administrators reported on unit level staffing of non nurse providers; in a subset of 70 NICUs in 2009–2010, census data were collected on four selected shifts (3,871 nurses and 9,276 infants assigned to them).

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Rota and staffing levels: • Overall, 10% neonatal units had gaps in medical staffing with 5% of these shifts covered by locums. Gaps were highest for Tier 1 and Tier 2 staff on the weekday (14%) and weekend day (7%) with few gaps at night (1-2%) • 15% of neonatal units had gaps in nurse staffing.
