Chashitsu in Japanese tradition is an architectural space designed to be used for tea ceremony gatherings. The architectural style that developed for chashitsu is referred to as the sukiya style, and the term sukiya may be used as a synonym for chashitsu. Related Japanese terms are chaseki, broadly meaning "place for tea", and implying any sort of space where people are seated to participate in tea ceremony, and chabana, "tea flowers", the style of flower arrangement associated with the tea cere

Arata Isozaki ' s new tea house is named ' Uji ' which is a Zen reference to the profundity of time, appropriately enough, for as Isozaki puts it ' to have tea is to pay close attention to the time of the very moment ' . It has been present in Japanese tea drinking culture as early as the 13 th century, and spread to all levels of society by the 16 th century, much furthered and influenced in the 15 th century by Sen No Rikyu – a famous tea master. Practitioners of Chado (茶道 ') spend a lifetime perfecting the gestures of tea preparation, considered a way to spiritual enlightenment.
